Monday, October 27, 2008: Red Ribbon Awareness Day

As a part of morning announcements, a short history of Red Ribbon Week will be presented. All students, faculty, and staff are encouraged to sign pledge "Stars", included with this memo, to be used in a display on a hallway wall. The display will be titled "Believe...Achieve...Succeed...Drug Free." Please return the signed stars (in the envelope provided) to the counselor's office by the end of the day on Monday.

A video will be shown at 9:00 and again at 2:30 today to celebrate Red Ribbon Week. You and your students are invited to tune in to either of the two presentations.
