## **Top Three Honorees Selected in MEEF Teacher of the Year Program**

The Muscogee Educational Excellence Foundation (MEEF) announced the Top Three honorees for the Muscogee County School District Teacher of the Year (TOTY) today, March 28, 2013. The Top Three were selected after interviews with the Top Ten finalists – each named the Teacher of the Year for their respective schools. Top Three Honorees are:

Brenda Howell	<i>Hardaway High, 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade – Environmental Science, Forensic Science, IB Environmental</i>
Ellen Lane	<i>Gentian Elementary – 5th grade</i>
Kim Lester	<i>Britt David Magnet Academy, 5th grade</i>

MEEF recognizes teachers who have dedicated themselves to excellence in the classroom. The Top Three will have an on-site classroom observation by the MEEF Selection Committee, which is made up of business and educational leaders in Columbus. After the observations at their respective schools, the Selection Committee will select the 2013 MCSD Teacher of the Year. The announcement for the 2013 Teacher of the Year will be announced at the TOTY Gala on Thursday, May 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Trade Center to an expected crowd of 800 supporters of excellence in education.

The gala is open to the public and tickets to the Gala can be purchased at Springer Box Office April 15 - 26 for \$35 each.

The Selection Committee members include MEEF Board members, community leaders and former MCSD Teachers of the Year.
