MCS D College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) Score Card Highest District Total to Date

(Columbus, GA)-The state of Georgia released its College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) score cards and the Muscogee County School District (MCS D) has it highest district total to date. CCRPI scores are based on the 2013-2014 assessments and performance.

- The District Total Score improved 1.9 points over last year's score
- 33 of 53 (62%) schools improved over last year's scores
- 23 of 33 (69.7%) elementary schools improved over last year's scores
- 7 of 9 (78%) high schools improved over last year's scores

"We are glad to see our highest district total CCRPI score to date," said Dr. David Lewis, superintendent. "In addition, the majority of our schools improved, which tells us the district realignment and curriculum adjustments that began over the last few years are having a positive impact."

The CCRPI is designed around a definition of college and career readiness, or the level of achievement required in order for a student to enroll in two or four year colleges and universities and technical colleges without remediation. Students are fully prepared for college-level work and careers.

The CCRPI replaces Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) as the accountability tool used by all Georgia Schools. CCRPI measures schools by a broader set of data than the old AYP, including factors such as graduation rate, performance on standardized tests (using the state of Georgia's Performance Standards and other required tests), student attendance, academic growth and success in closing student performance gaps.

Each school receives a score out of 100 points, and a school and district's overall score is made up of three major areas:

- Achievement (60 points possible)
- Progress (25 points possible)
- Achievement Gap (15 points possible)

Plus, some schools receive *Challenge Points* to add to their score (up to 10 points). Schools receive these points if they have a significant number of Economically Disadvantaged students, English Learner students and Students with Disabilities meeting expectations. Points are also earned for going beyond the targets of the CCRPI by challenging students to exceed expectations and participate in college and career readiness programs.

Veronica Collins, Chief Academic Officer says, "Research confirms the best practice for improving student growth and achievement is evidenced by steady and consistent gains. We are enthusiastic about the gains we have made and work towards a continuous trend of improvement in positive student outcomes. We know our job is never done, and we remain dedicated to improving system wide in all areas."
